The American Legion and the Department of Defense have teamed up and formed the Heroes to Hometowns program to provide these dedicated Americans all the help they need to reestablish their lives when they come home.

Your local American Legion Post 36 had chosen to participate in the Heroes to Hometowns program before learning that they had a wounded Windsor Locks resident coming home. Staff Sgt. Barry Albert lost his leg following an attack on four U.S. Army vehicles back in May. The program has been challenged with the task of making Sgt. Albert's home handicapped accessible.
